Community Development Work December 2025

As your Community Development Worker, I have had many enjoyable moments over these recent months since our last church magazine but until somebody makes that clear transaction with Jesus, their sin for His righteousness, I will not be satisfied. The families enjoy the great space and toys we have for them upstairs in the church every Tuesday. Fresh hot toast is always in demand and regular supplies of tea and coffee for the adults who bring their families along.

Thursday is Warm Space afternoon from 1pm until 6pm usually with a birthday to celebrate. We buy a giant chocolate & cream sponge from Morrisons and see a miracle each week as the cake is cut and provides a little taste for everyone.

Messy Church is running again on the first Sunday of the month. Sunday 7th December will be Christmas Messy Church. This year we are extending more invitations than ever before. With support from the Growing Young team, we are giving personal invitations to the Rainbows, Brownies and Guides who meet on Mondays and Wednesdays, the Singing Mamas group who meet on Wednesdays, the Thursday Baby Sensory group along with our usual invitations to the schools, Babies & Toddlers, Warm Spaces and the 700 leaflets we will put through local doors the week leading up to Messy Church. As a church, it's great to see our doors open to the local community with these groups and many other things taking place in our building.

At this time of Christmas celebrations, may the people of Letham know the reality of John 3:16 for themselves and may we serve God well as we invite people to be reconciled to Him — 2 Corinthians 5:20.

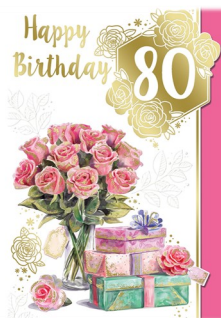


We know Hazel won't be a stranger, she will still be attending church and she'll pop into the café for her wee coffee and scone.

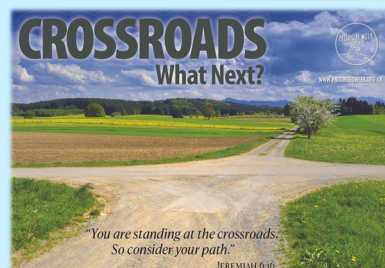
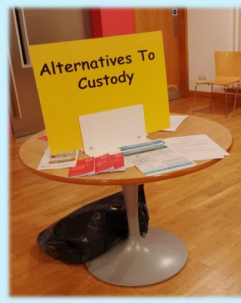

Prisoners Week National Launch Service

Attendees included the Chief Executive of the SPS, two former His Majesty's Chief Inspectors of Prisons, serving and former prisoners and Prison Fellowship volunteers, as well as a very good turnout of church folk. Singer Barbara Dickson, who is patron of the Prisoners Week Trust, performed for us, and governor Natalie Beal spoke inspiringly about this year's theme of "Crossroads: What next?" There was an audio recording of some prayers written and spoken by people currently in custody. It was lovely to have our former worship leader Chris White leading the singing.

The Prisoners Week Planning Group are *extremely* grateful to "Team LSM" for the lovely hospitality and all the work behind the scenes to make this happen. In the Bible, when Peter is sent to prison, Acts 12:5 tells us that "the church was earnestly praying to God for him". Please do continue to remember people in prison (and their families and victims and prison staff too). An update from Karlien Becker

Hennie and I can't believe how time has flown. We are already 18 months in Scotland, a year and a half! Fifteen of these were in Perth, and we are already three months in Maybole. I was inducted as the minister of North Carrick Parish on the 9th of September. Hennie also started to work as an Electrical Engineer at Omexom at the beginning of November.

We are very grateful how things are working out for us. We do miss Perth and all our friends we made at Letham St Mark's, but we are also settling well into Maybole and we love our home with beautiful views over the Carrick hills.

North Carrick Parish was formed by the union of Maybole, Kirkoswald and Crosshill. Each still have their own building and we have 3 services on a Sunday, with the help of an OLM and Worship leaders.

I'm starting to get to know the people in the town and the villages. The Carrick Centre in Maybole is a very busy place with a Café open 6 days of the week and a lot of groups using the halls; it is a good place to meet people.

It has been a busy time. I have already led a Kirk Session meeting. We have had Communion services, Harvest services, a baptism, a combined Remembrance service with other churches in Maybole and there have been funerals, a memorial service and I also have a small group of young people doing the Alpha course.

We have made a new website, Facebook & YouTube Pages. I visited the schools for assemblies, there are four primary schools, and one Secondary school in our Parish. I attend our Guild, community lunches, choir practice and do house visits to meet the people and to give pastoral support. We are now planning for our Christmas Fayre, Carol service and Christmas services.

In between work Hennie and I are still exploring this beautiful part of Scotland, we've seen Dumfries House, Loch Doon, Glasgow Cathedral, Culzean Castle and went to Ireland for two days. We love living in the countryside with green hills, farms, sheep & cattle but we are just 15 minutes away from Ayr and Prestwick with many shops and we are also near the beach. Maidens & Turnberry next to the coast is also part of the parish.

We feel blessed. We want to thank everyone for your support and prayers and thank you to those who came all the way from Perth to Maybole for my Induction. It was a very special evening and I'm glad we could share it with you. I also want to thank you for the generous gift I received from Letham friends.

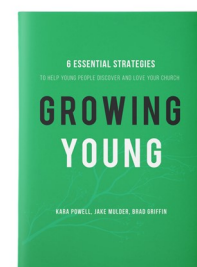

CHRISTIAN AID CHRISTMAS APPEAL 2025

No Crib for a Bed

After the birth of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, his family had to flee to Egypt to escape Caesar's reign of terror in their home country. This Christmas, Christian Aid is highlighting communities affected by conflict, especially displaced women with children. We are invited to consider families like Chance's — facing unimaginable hardship after fleeing violence

Meet Chance

Chance lived in Minova, a small farming community on the shores of Lake Kivu, East Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). She is married, with eight children, the youngest being a small baby. Her older children went to school; she worked as a shopkeeper alongside her husband

"I thought my life would be happy – to work with my husband, feed and educate our children. I never expected to leave my village."

When violence reached her village, Chance knew she had to escape with her children to survive. Her husband remained, and is feared killed in the conflict.

For days, Chance and her children fled on foot, terrified and exhausted, searching for safety, carrying her 2-month-old. Each step was a fight for survival. They eventually reached Katashola Camp, where they are safe from the conflict, but have only what they were wearing and carrying to make a new life.

Chance isn't alone. She's one of millions forced from their homes in the DRC – one of the largest, and now most urgent, humanitarian crises of our time.

"I wish you could help me and my companions who are suffering like me. Please help us."

Though Chance is a resourceful mother, she now has very few options – because her situation is beyond her control. Her dream is to protect her children so they can grow up in peace — and one day see her baby become a journalist who gives a voice to others like her.

Conflict in the DRC: an ongoing humanitarian emergency

The Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) has been repeatedly devastated by centuries of violence, leaving homes destroyed, livelihoods lost and families displaced. Today, the DRC faces one of the largest global hunger crises, with over 27 million people in urgent need of food.

Christian Aid is working with trusted local partners to deliver families like Chance's a vital lifeline – a financial assistance programme, bringing immediate emergency aid to families who've fled their homes. Christian Aid funds cash grants for mothers to buy nutritious food, medicine, and hygiene supplies that could save children's lives and protect them from hunger, malnutrition, disease and pain.

£15 could buy the 20kg bag of beans, adding vital minerals to a family's diet—helping fight malnutrition.

£36 could provide personal hygiene kits for more than one family, keeping children safe and healthy.

£70 could fund pots, cups, bowls, plates and spoons for a family who've lost everything.
