We continued Messy Church also through April, May & June sticking with our theme of 'Encounters with Jesus'. These have been great opportunities to meet new people, develop new friendships and share the good news that God so loved each and every one of us that He gave Jesus to save us. This is the message that we must always keep at the forefront of our minds. A simple, short, sentence that is as broad and long, high and deep, as the love of God itself. We also ran another After School Club at Our Lady's primary school working in partnership with the school, Letham4All, and Families Empowering Communities. BLYTHSWOOD CARE SHOEBOX APPEAL 2025

Last year 120 boxes for the appeal were supplied by Letham St Mark's Church. They became part of a consignment of 7835 boxes sent to **Ukraine** from the sorts in Perth and the surrounding area.

The filled shoeboxes from the Perth region are being sent to **Ukraine** again this year.

There are some practicalities we need to be aware of. The shipping is more costly and a lot stricter than other shoebox destinations. As a result we are not able to send cartons filled with various goods, clothes, blankets, hats etc. We can only send filled shoeboxes.

This year's appeal will launch with a Coffee Morning in Perth Baptist Church on Saturday 30th August from 10.00am – 12noon.

It is planned to have wrapped boxes ready in Letham St Mark's to be taken and filled from Sunday 7th September, and returned, please, no later than Sunday 19th October.

For the last few years, there has been a shortage of boxes for teens, boys and men, and we are being encouraged to consider that when preparing to fill a box. Thank you. The main sort will be from Monday 10th to Thursday 13th November, at Perth Baptist Church.

Important: please only include new items.

- 7. Sweets No chocolate, split multipacks or any other food items. No loose sweets, lollies or undated bags of sweets. Best before dates, no earlier than 31st March, 2026.

Do not include used or damaged items: war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; mouth-wash; seeds; hand-made or knitted stuffed toys; chocolate or any other food other than sweets. Chocolate eclairs and chocolate limes are also not allowed; books that are mainly words should also not be included.



Two female P7 pupils came on our P+K SU weekend to Alltnacriche and had a great time. At the P7 leavers assembly instead of us saying the prayers the two pupils prayed, which we felt was much more appropriate.


